

CALL FOR PROPOSALS – WORKSHOPS

Workshops are typically partial- or full-day sessions that facilitate discussion and exploration of ideas, techniques, and methodologies that advance research, teaching knowledge of IS-related concepts, or products from industry and their application to academia, educational curricula, or industry practice.

In keeping with the AMCIS 2024 theme, “Elevating life through digital social entrepreneurship,” our special focus for this conference is to recruit workshops highlighting the innovative use of information technology in industry and academia. We encourage sessions that support professional development for IS academics, researchers, and practitioners.

Workshops are considered pre-conference activities and can be proposed as a 2-hour, 4-hour, 6-hour, or full-day session on Wednesday, August 14, and Thursday, August 15. After you submit a proposal, if additional details need to be worked out, those will be handled in a follow-up discussion with the workshops committee.
